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

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2.6 .1 Methods of the assessment of learning outcomes and graduate attributes



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2.6.1 Methods of the assessment of learning outcomes and graduate attributes

The students in each year are assessed in a regular manner throughout their course. The Institute lists the competencies expected from the graduate as per the BDS regulations issued by the Dental Council of India (DCI) and Kerala University of Health Sciences (KUHS). The students are explained the competencies to be attained after covering the curriculum.

1. Summative Assessment: - University Examination:

It is done by the university through an examination, both theory and practical, conducted at the end of the specified course. Theory paper is for 70 marks, viva voce has 20 marks and practical marks are for 80.

2. Formative Assessment: - Internal Assessment:

An assessment conducted by the institution with the purpose of providing feedback for improving learning. It helps the students to identify their strengths and weaknesses and target areas that need work. It helps faculty to recognize where students are struggling and address problems immediately. It is done through a series of tests and examinations conducted periodically. A maximum of 10 marks for theory and 20 marks for practical are added along with the University exam marks for the final result.

- The objective methods adopted by our institution are as follows-
- 1. Assignments
- 2. Group Discussions
- 3. Case presentation
- 4. Clinical End posting exams
- 5. Model Practical Exams/Mock Exams
- 6. Records/Log Books
- 7. Seminar Presentations
- 8. Internal Theory Examination
- 9. Viva voice

Assignments

Assignments are allotted to each student to guide them in learning the subject. These are related to theory and clinical portions. It is written by referring to standard textbooks and journals and submitted to the faculty for evaluation. Then a viva voce is conducted for each student. It helps the students to understand the topic well.

Group Discussions

Group discussions are carried out on a particular topic. A topic is allotted and the students are given time to prepare. After that detailed discussion is done. In the end, a question-answer session is conducted.

Case Presentations

Patient cases are allotted to each student. They are given time for case-taking. Students present the case - complaints of the patient, history, medical status of the patient, and relevant clinical findings. Based on which diagnosis and treatment plan for that particular patient is decided. This helps to assess the clinical knowledge of the student

Clinical End posting exams

At the completion of clinical posting, an end-posting exam is conducted for each student to assess their clinical skills.

Model Practical Examination

Mock exams are conducted prior to their university practical examination. It includes both preclinical and clinical exams.

Records/ Log Books

The candidate is given credit for their records based on the scores obtained in the record.

Seminar Presentations

Students are allotted a seminar topic in every subject. It is presented at the time of clinical posting in respective departments. This helps to assess their subject knowledge also their presentation skills.

Internal Theory Examination

Each year, three internal examinations are conducted as per the KUHS university regulations, and question papers are prepared in such a way that it covers all the important topics. All students must score minimum 50% marks in internal examinations to be eligible for the university exam.

Viva voice

Viva voice helps to assess the student on an individual basis

THE LEARNING OUTCOME of the program is calculated by summing up the direct assessment values.

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Program outcome calculation

- 1. First the percentage of class average from internal assessment (CIE) and final exam marks (SEE) are calculated
- 2. Based on the percentage obtained a class level is fixed for that batch as mentioned below
 - Level 1 = 30%students scored more than class average
 - Level 2 = 40% students scored more than class average
 - Level 3 = 50% students scored more than class average.
- 3. Our college level was set as LEVEL 2
- 4. Overall course outcome (CO) was calculated using the formula 0.1x average CIE + 0.9 x average SEE
- 5. Graduate attribute articulation matrix is calculated based on the graduate attributes from the curriculum.
 - 6. Rule of third is applied -1/3 (PO mapping) x CO value
 - 7. Average of the PO values are calculated
 - 7. Attainment level is fixed

- Level 1 - 0.5 to 1

Level 2 - 1.1 to 1.5

Level 3 - 1.6 to 2

Level 4 - 2.1 to 2.5

- 8. Our college level was set at LEVEL 3
- 9. Percentage of PO value is calculated
- 10. If it falls within Level 3 1.6 to 2 then our college has attained PO value

Our PO value was 2.17 so we have achieved our attainment level
